BISHOP'S LODGE HISTORIC HOUSE & GARDEN

Bishop's Lodge Historic House is a remarkable iron house and outbuildings designed and built in 1888 by Bishop Sydney Linton, the Anglican Bishop of the Riverina and architect, John Sulman. It incorporates innovative design ideas for mitigating Hay's extreme summer heat including: the use of iron which cools faster than brick, a six inch layer of saw dust between the inner and outer walls, raised ventilators under the eaves for all rooms and positioning all windows and doors to enable a cross raft to be drawn into most rooms.

Bishop's Lodge is surrounded by a heritage garden featuring a remarkable collection of historic roses. Bishop's Lodge is a popular venue for weddings and community events and is maintained by a dedicated group of community volunteers.

OPENING HOURS

Monday to Friday 10am – 4pm, Saturday 9am – 12noon. Bishop's Lodge offers self-guided tours through the house with a remote entry.

COST

Entry into the Lodge is a cost of \$5.00 per person.

If you are in a group of 20 or more the entry will be \$4.00 per person.

Entry fees are paid with cash inside the building through the honesty box. Or you can pay for your entry via credit card with the Visitor Centre at the time of remote entry.
